

Shenandoah University Profile

Shenandoah University, located in Winchester, Va., is a private university with an enrollment of approximately 3,500 students in six schools: College of Arts & Sciences, Harry F. Byrd Jr. School of Business, Shenandoah Conservatory, School of Education & Human Development, School of Health Professions (athletic training, nursing, occupational therapy, physical therapy, physician assistant studies and respiratory care) and Bernard J. Dunn School of Pharmacy.

Students represent most of the 50 United States and almost 40 countries. Shenandoah offers more than 80 programs of study at the undergraduate, graduate and professional levels. It is one of two private doctoral degree-granting institutions in Virginia. With its unique vision and highly-qualified faculty, Shenandoah University maintains a curriculum that reflects the constantly changing demands of the market and prepares students for the technological and global environment of the 21st century.

Head Coach Kevin Anderson, Shenandoah University

Kevin Anderson is in his sixth season as the fourth Head Baseball Coach in Shenandoah University history. In that time, Anderson has led SU to six consecutive 20-win seasons and a school-record 37 wins this year.

A Winchester native, Anderson was appointed as one of two Interim Athletic Directors for the department in May 2009. He, along with Kim Scruton, direct a department that serves over 400 student-athletes in 20 different intercollegiate athletic programs.

Anderson and his wife, Ginger, have been married for 13 years and are the parents of three children: Kolton, 10; Kooper, 9; and Khloe, 4.

Shenandoah University Baseball Notes

Winning Ways – The Hornets' 37 victories in 2009 is a school record.

Famous Firsts – This was Shenandoah's first baseball championship of any kind since 1991 when it won the South Regional. It was also the first NCAA regional championship for the school. This marks the first time in school history Shenandoah has played baseball games in May. For five Shenandoah players, flying to the finals of the NCAA Division III Championship marks their first time on an airplane.

Making It A Foursome – Shenandoah's baseball team is fourth squad in school history to qualify for NCAA tournament play. Shenandoah's men's basketball, women's basketball and football teams have also reached the NCAAs.

The One And Only – Senior second baseman/pitcher Josh Simons was the lone Shenandoah player selected to the All-USA South Conference first team. Simons was named third team All-America by D3baseball.com.

Tourney Honors – Kevin Brashears, Jon Holcomb, Greg Van Sickler and Jasen Eberz named USA South All-Tournament Team. Brashears also was named the Most Outstanding Player of the South Regional. Van Sickler, Jesse Henry and Cory Nelson also were named to the all-region tournament team.

Smarty Pants – Catcher/outfielder Scott Lambert was a first-team pick on the 2009 *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District 3 Team.
